	Name of Beneficiary	Brief Description of Services
1.	Autism Children's Centre	The programme focuses on the educational and developmental needs of children with autism. The Early Intervention Programme for Infants and Children (EIPIC) aim to provide the earliest intervention possible for young children with autism at the stage where their functioning capacity could be further developed and increased. It also aims to promote the parent partnership with the intention of helping parents be proactive in their engagement with their children through growth and development.
2.	Spastic Children's Association School (SCAS)	This special school caters to children with cerebral palsy, aged 5 - 18 years, in their academic and non-academic needs. Due to their condition, students often require specialised intensive therapy rehabilitation. SCAS provides individual or group therapy sessions with speech, occupational and physiotherapists. Pre-vocational training is also provided to prepare students for future employment either in sheltered workshops or in the open market.
3.	Rainbow Centre Margaret Drive Special School	This programme caters to infants and young children aged 2 months to 4 years who have Down's syndrome, developmental delay, cerebral palsy, multiple disabilities or autism.
4.	MINDS Guillemard Gardens School	The school provides special education for children with intellectual disability, aged 4-18 years.
5.	Grace Orchard School	This is a special school catered for children aged 6 to 18 years with mild to moderate intellectual disability and those who are on the autism spectrum.
6.	Katong School	The special school provides special education for children with mild mental retardation, aged 6-12 years. The aim of the special education programme is to provide education and training so as to enable the children to have the necessary skills, attitude and personality to lead normal independent lives in adulthood.
7.	Canossian School	The School provides nursery and pre-school programmes; and primary school education

		for children with hearing impairment, aged 0-12 years. It also provides support services for parents, e.g. sign language courses, parental support and guidance programmes.
8.	ASPN Delta Senior School	The Centre was set up with the purpose to help children and youths in the neighbouring schools. The Centre is recognised by the Ministry of Education, for its valuable service to schools.
9.	Bestari Institute of Technical Education (bITE Programme)	This programme focuses on services for youths, including: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. School Social Work 2. Counselling/Casework 3. Preventive Programmes 4. Developmental Programmes 5. Youth Drop-in Centre
10.	Uth Power!	The programme seeks to provide emotional, social and familial support to enable students to obtain maximum benefits from their schooling experience. It reaches out to students either from EM3 or Normal Technical Stream. It caters to the neighbourhood schools in Upper Serangoon and Paya Lebar areas as well as other schools that are not within their immediate vicinity, such as Jurong.
11.	Cyber Counselling for Youth	This online counselling agency uses the latest communication technology to reach out to youth who are internet savvy and who may find online counselling less threatening and easily accessible.
12.	WINGS Counselling Centre	The programme serves the following segments of the community : <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) Children and youths with behavioural, emotional and educational problems. b) Dysfunctional families which are often the root causes of psychological problems of children & youths. c) Parents in need of guidance to manage the changing needs of their growing children. d) Teachers in need of assistance to identify high-risk students for early intervention.

13.	SCS Educational Psychology Service	Casework and counselling are the core services in SCS and is managed by social workers. They work with students from kindergarten to junior college or those between the ages of 5 and 18. The kinds of cases handled in SCS often involve the growing pains of childhood and the teenage years. These may include truancy, child misbehaviour, a teenager's negotiation for independence, parenting issues, and issues involving school work and grades.
14.	Students Care Service (Clementi Centre)	It is a community-based social service agency serving the needs of students between 5 to 18 years. It has a team of professional staff comprising social workers, learning support specialists and educational psychologist. Its mission is to be a leading social service agency in enabling students to maximise their potential, by working in partnership with schools, families and others in the community.
15.	Students Care Service (Hougang Centre)	It is a community-based social service agency serving the needs of students between 5 to 18 years. It has a team of professional staff comprising social workers, learning support specialists and educational psychologist. Its mission is to be a leading social service agency in enabling students to maximise their potential, by working in partnership with schools, families and others in the community.
16.	Students Care Service (Yishun Centre)	It is a community-based social service agency serving the needs of students between 5 to 18 years. It has a team of professional staff comprising social workers, learning support specialists and educational psychologist. Its mission is to be a leading social service agency in enabling students to maximise their potential, by working in partnership with schools, families and others in the community.
17.	Loving Heart Multi-Service Centre (Jurong Central)	This is a joint project by the South West Community Development Council, PAP Community Foundation (Yuhua Branch) with two voluntary welfare organisations, Cheng Hong (Siang Tng) Charitable Organisation and Thye Hua Kwan Moral Society. LHMSC is part-funded by South West CDC and is supported by the Ministry of Community Development and Sports. Its services are targeted at residents of Yuhua Constituency and South West CDC area.

18.	YMCA	YMCA of Singapore is a Christian organization, affiliated worldwide, which seeks to serve and enrich all members of the community, regardless of race, language or religion, through wholesome programmes to develop Body, Mind and Spirit, which are based on Christian principles.
19.	Darul Ihsan Orphanage	<p>Darul Ihsan was instituted to provide for the maintenance, care and education of orphans of Muslim parents. 20.	Infant Jesus Homes & Children's Centres	<p>The Infant Jesus Homes and Children's Centres (formerly known as the Convent Orphanage and Home for abandoned Babies), runs three Homes and Children's Centres in Singapore.</p> <p>The three centres are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Infant Jesus Home, Ang Mo Kio - Infant Jesus Centre, Clementi - Galilee Centre, Ang Mo Kio (formerly located in Jalan Kayu) <p>The Home in Ang Mo Kio is a community home for women brought up at the CHIJ Orphanage, Victoria Street. It also provides care for the disabled and sick.</p> <p>The two Children's centres provide educational support to children in the neighbourhood who come from poor and difficult family backgrounds. These children, because of the family background or intelligence level, normally either do not have the opportunity for formal education or are sidelined by the mainstream education system and cannot perform well in school.</p>
